

	 Jetbead (RHSC3) Shrub, opposite branching Leaves have ribbed veins with long tips, almost look pleated. White flowers in April to early June. Fruits come in fours; dark reddish at first and then black as they mature (Sept-Dec) 	
	Japanese/Chinese wisteria	
	(WIFO2) Twining vine Leaves – <u>compound</u> with many long narrow leaflets (7-19.) Pointed at tip. <u>Untoothed</u> margin Seeds – large bean-pod capsules. Hairy. Begin forming in early summer	
VINES	Porcelainberry (AMBR7)	
	Twining vine with tendrils, like grape	
	Bark not shredding off in strips	
	Leaves – <u>green beneath</u> . Often	
	deeply lobed. Variable shape.	
	Fruit – borne <u>erect</u> , not dangling.	
	Small berries are multicolored	
	 Black swallowwort (CYLO11) Herbaceous vine 	
	 Leaves – opposite. Long, 	
	pointed, <u>dark green</u> .	
	<u>Smooth</u> . Unlobed	
	 Flowers – clusters, <u>tiny</u> 	
	 <u>dark purple</u> at leaf bases Seeds – milkweed-like 	
	 Seeds – milkweed-like pods in the fall 	
	Chinese bush-clover (LECU)	
	 Herbaceous perennial 	
BES	with alternate branching.	
OR	• Leaflets come in pairs of	
JS F	three; short bristles on tips with silvery hairs on	
	the underside.	
HERBACIOUS FORBES	 White/purple flowers in 	
HER	leaf axils, blooming July-	
-	Oct.
