

## QUICK ID GUIDE - INVASIVES STRIKE FORCE 2018 Emerging Intermediate Invasives

	<ul> <li>Jetbead (RHSC3)</li> <li>Shrub, opposite branching</li> <li>Leaves have ribbed veins with long tips, almost look pleated.</li> <li>White flowers in April to early June.</li> <li>Fruits come in fours; dark reddish at first and then black as they mature (Sept-Dec)</li> </ul>	
	Japanese/Chinese wisteria	
	(WIFO2) Twining vine Leaves – <u>compound</u> with many long narrow leaflets (7-19.) Pointed at tip. <u>Untoothed</u> margin Seeds – large bean-pod capsules. Hairy. Begin forming in early summer	
VINES	Porcelainberry (AMBR7)	
	Twining vine with tendrils, like grape	
	Bark not shredding off in strips	
	Leaves – <u>green beneath</u> . Often	
	deeply lobed. Variable shape.	
	Fruit – borne <u>erect</u> , not dangling.	
	Small berries are multicolored	
	<ul> <li>Black swallowwort (CYLO11)</li> <li>Herbaceous vine</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Leaves – opposite. Long,</li> </ul>	
	pointed, <u>dark green</u> .	
	<u>Smooth</u> . Unlobed	
	<ul> <li>Flowers – clusters, <u>tiny</u></li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li><u>dark purple</u> at leaf bases</li> <li>Seeds – milkweed-like</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Seeds – milkweed-like pods in the fall</li> </ul>	
	Chinese bush-clover (LECU)	
	<ul> <li>Herbaceous perennial</li> </ul>	
BES	with alternate branching.	
OR	• Leaflets come in pairs of	
JS F	three; short bristles on tips with silvery hairs on	
	the underside.	
HERBACIOUS FORBES	<ul> <li>White/purple flowers in</li> </ul>	
HER	leaf axils, blooming July-	
-	Oct.
